Nunny's Farm Deaf Awareness Event



The Educational Team for Hearing and Vision (ETHV) joined local deaf children and their parent carers at Nunny's Farm, Nunsthorpe on Saturday, 21 May.

The event was organised in

celebration of Deaf Awareness Week that was held earlier in the month.

It was made possible by the generosity of Joanna, Neil, and their team who allowed the group free entry, and a space to gather for our first Deaf Awareness family event.

The children got to see, stroke and feed sheep, goats, alpacas, cows, donkeys, pigs, ponies, ducks, chickens, turkeys, guinea pigs and rabbits.

The farm has a community orchard, wildlife meadow and community garden. There are also catering facilities, a shop and toilets.

The farm has hearing aid colours, designs and attachments and has Makaton signs on the animal's enclosures.

The event was a chance for children to share more of their ideas of what they would like to do together and for parent carers to share their experiences with others like



them.

To carry out the research the young people have helped to plan and prepare a number of interactive activities to gather the research with young people (aged 16-25) and Older people (aged 60+ who were a teenager in the area). These include small focus groups, 1-1 interviews and community walks. The focus groups and walks are planned to take around 2 hours and the 1-1 interviews around 30-45 minutes each. The activities to gather the information will be held between the end of May and end of July and we expect the results to be available by the end of September. All participants will be invited to hear the findings of the research and next steps.

Need support in the evenings?

Feeling low, lonely or vulnerable in the evening? Walk in Safespace or join online.

Safespace :: NAViGO (navigocare.co.uk)

We can all feel vulnerable from time to time – especially in the evenings. Safespace is an out-of-hours, open door crisis cafe where you can get instant and practical mental health support.

If you're feeling low in the evenings, you can drop into Safespace and speak to fullytrained mental health professionals who will help you manage your wellbeing.

Or, if you'd rather stay at home, you can contact us using Zoom between 5.30pm and 11pm, Monday to Friday.

It's a judgement-free zone and we welcome those who are in need – whether that be due to <u>loneliness</u>, isolation or emotional vulnerability. There's no need to call ahead – just drop in.

Safespace is a former **<u>NAViGO Project of the Year</u>** winner and a joint initiative with **<u>North East LincoInshire Mind</u>**. We opened our doors in April 2019.

<u>Teen life</u>

Teen Life is a six-session programme **free** of cost for parent carers of young people aged 10-16 with a diagnosis of an Autistic Spectrum Condition.

Teen Life is offered by NELC Community Educational Psychology Service, autism experienced, professionals who have been trained and licensed by The National Autistic Society's Licensed Training team to run the programme for families in their local area.

Session last for two and a half hours.

Three places are allocated on the Teen Life Programme. There are two for parent carers and one for a professional if you would like to bring one.

Topics include understanding autism in teenagers, women and girls, self-esteem, spending time with other people, stress and anxiety, behaviours, puberty, independence skills, education strategies and planning for their future.
