CAREERS UPDATE

Key stage 3 - This term examined the Health and Social Care sector and looking at the different job roles. They have also visited two local residential homes in Grimsby and Cleethorpes.

Next term they will be looking at the Construction sector, what roles are available within this industry, and we will be visiting Grimsby Institute to look at their construction offer.

Key stage 4- This term our learners have been visiting local colleges Linkage and Grimsby and they have met with YPSS to draft their college applications.

Some of the learners have visited Motorvation in Hull to look at their setting in regard to studying Vehicle Maintenance with them. All the learners who went were impressed and have stated that they want to go there for their post-16 destination. They have also offered some of our learners work experience next year!

Next term, the learners will be looking at the STEM industry and will be visiting a local factory.

There will also be a guest speaker from the Royal Navy to share their experiences and roles within this service. Orchard Construction will also be coming into the school and speaking to Key stage 4 around the construction industry and apprenticeships that they offer.

BTEC COOKING

Across KS4, many of our learners have just completed their BTEC Cooking Lv 1/2 this week. During the course, they have cooked a variety of dishes including pizza, pasta, homemade bread, treacle sponge pudding and chocolate chip cookies. In particular, Laceby Class 2 chose treacle sponge as their favourite cooking week as it was combined with the homemade ice cream they made that same week during Science. Learners have said they are enjoying the opportunity to try new foods and feel more confident cooking at home now.

Class 9 also had the opportunity to showcase their skills by inviting parents and carers in to sample their new culinary skills. Everyone enjoyed the food that was prepared and served to them.
