#### **BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK 2025**

British Science Week is a ten-day celebration of science, technology, engineering and maths that takes place between 7-16 March 2025!

During British Science Week, all students were given the opportunity to take part in a variety of STEM activities. We also held our own poster competition allowing students to explore the concept of adapt and change. The variety in the poster entries really highlighted how each class adapted the task to meet the diverse interests of our learners. Some KS3 learners also chose to visit the Magna Science Adventure Centre as part of Orchard in the Community.

Next term, KS3 will be exploring facts about the career they are interested in and completing a portfolio on it and presenting it to their peers.
