## Latest News

In October 2024, NE Lincs Education Leadership team and representatives from Lincolnshire Gateway Academies Trust attended evening engagement sessions with residents, prospective parents and potential staff for the two new schools set to open in our local area in September 2025. The new primaries are being built on Scartho Top and near Sunningdale in Waltham. Both settings will have a SEND Resources Base, increasing the number of special school places available locally for Primary age pupils.



## SEND Focus

The training room was buzzing in October 2024 as Jacob Lawton from Wellspring Academy Trust began his series of Positive Regard sessions for teaching professionals. This training forms part of NE Lincs commitment to developing a truly graduated response and a relational approach to supporting children and young people who are finding their education journey difficult. Booking has opened for this pilot project and all the 10 schools who were offered a place have signed up.

## Building for the Future

Coming soon; the High Needs Capital Grant small awards scheme. The funding is to support inclusion in mainstream settings by making improvements to spaces.

Any education setting who has not yet received, or due to receive, High Needs Capital Grant can apply for a one off amount up to £10,000





# SETTING OF THE MONTH

## Lisle Marsden Church of England Primary Academy

Lisle Marsden has been running a successful Makaton Club enjoyed by both staff and pupils. 8 staff and 15 pupils regularly participate in the activity that is led by two members of the SEND Team as an activity during the school day and as an after-school club. As well as being a fun activity for everyone to participate in, the skills they learn are used within the classroom.

The school also have three staff members who are trained as Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSAs). Pupils learn to understand their emotions, cope with transitions and changes, the benefits of mindfulness and more. These social and emotional skills are delivered in a practical way to help students navigate situations within, and out of school, with confidence. Staff say that the benefits of the support has been noticeable as the soft skills students learn strengthens their emotional wellbeing and act as a foundation for wider learning, forming social connections, and being confident in their ability to learn.

## ASK ANNIE

### INDEPENDENT TRAVEL TRAINING

Independent Travel Training (ITT) is a free scheme for young people aged 14 years with an EHCP and over who are currently in full-time education and are in receipt of local authority transport support. It helps them to travel independently between college/school and home.

ITT encourages children and young people with special educational needs to reach their potential.

The ITT team work with young people through referrals from schools, colleges, and parent/carers.

We have two Travel Trainers, John and Malcolm who are both really experienced in helping young people gain the skills needed for independence and would be happy to have a chat to discuss a referral.

Supported Internship is a study programme that includes extensive on-the-job training and works well for people with learning disabilities and/or Autism.

The Supported Internships are for youngsters in full time education that have an Education, Health and Care Plan. The internships help young people achieve their aspirations and offer them a pathway to paid employment.

Our programmes are at Diana Princess of Wales Hospital Grimsby with Linkage providing the education and our latest programme is joint between Humberside Police and North East Lincolnshire Council with Learning4Life-GY as the education provider.
