DofE is a scheme open to any young person aged 14-24. Each young person builds their own DofE programmes- picking their own activities and choosing which cause to volunteer for in order to achieve a Bronze, Silver and Gold Award. ## AUTHOR VISITS



Leanne Thompson, a local SEND author visited Orchard on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> December. She read some of the books she has written to our learners. The books are a series of rhyming stories with characters that explain differences to children in a way they can relate to and understand but also help adults and peers learn how to help and support in moments of difficulty.

Our learners loved listening to the stories and had so many questions for Leanne. They also offered suggestions for the new book she is writing. We are hoping that Leanne will visit us again next year.

## CAREERS

This half term KS3 and Foundation learners have been looking at different careers in the transport sector. The learners had the opportunity to experience train travel firsthand, getting on the train at Great Coates to Grimsby Town Station and back. They spoke to the driver and the staff at the train station and the learners absolutely loved this little outing, learning a lot about the careers involved within the rail industry.

### ORCHARDS MISSION CHRISTMAS

This year for our annual 'Orchard's Mission Christmas' our learners took part in a 5km sponsored walk around GTFC's Blundell Park and also enjoyed Christmas Carolling at our local Tesco supermarket. Our learners did amazingly well at both events, and we managed to raise a huge £2,190 (the most we have ever raised for our mission Christmas appeal). The money will go to local children who might be at risk of not receiving a Christmas present and also donations to local food banks in need of food. We have been out shopping and will be donating the items bought to Women's Aid, Salvation Army, We Are One Foundation and Grimsby Food Kitchen. We would like to thank all learners, parents and carers for getting behind us yet again on this.



## HEALTHIER FOOD OPTIONS

We have identified that perhaps our dinner menus could use a healthy update, and with this in mind from Spring 1 we will be introducing some healthier options. Chocolate bars will no longer be available, but wafers/biscuits will be served each Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Other days, yogurt, fruit and sugar free jelly/angel delight will be on offer. Fruit will be available every day, and milkshakes will also be swapped out for less sugary alternatives. We hope that parents/carers can get behind us on these much needed changes and promote the healthier alternatives.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As we come to the end of the Autumn Term, I would like to reflect on what has been a very positive term for our school community. Our new learners have settled in brilliantly, adding real value to school life, and I am incredibly proud of how all of our learners represent the school beyond the classroom. This was highlighted by being named finalists at the National NASS Awards for our cross-generational work in care homes.

This term, our learners have continued to make a positive impact within the wider community. Our ongoing improvements are built on strong partnerships with parents, carers, and professionals, and your voice continues to shape our work.
