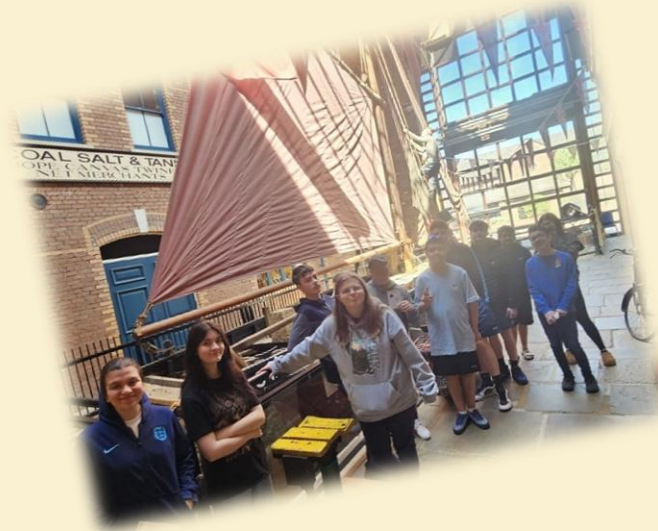
We wish each and every one of you every success in the exciting chapter ahead.

We are delighted to announce that Orchard Humber have achieved the School Games Gold Mark Award for the 2025/26 academic year.

The School Games Mark is a government-led award scheme launched in 2012, facilitated by the Youth Sport Trust to reward schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community, and we are delighted to have been recognised for our success.

Our sporting achievements this year include: **13 Sports fixtures/competitions against other schools, 3 internal sports competitions. A Humber regional first place in Penathalon. Inclusion of Sensory Circuits. 10 learners completed BTEC entry level 1 Sports Studies. 30 active minutes being hit.**

With a total of young people competing in local inter-school competitions this year, we are extremely proud of our pupils for their dedication to all aspects of school sport, including those young volunteers, leaders and officials who made our competitions possible.

PREVENT

At Orchard, we teach our learners how to stay safe, make good choices, and talk to adults if something worries them. Part of this includes our **Prevent duty**, which is just a way of helping protect children from people who might try to influence them in unsafe or unkind ways, especially online.

We keep things very simple and age-appropriate, and we focus on helping pupils understand what feels safe and what doesn't. If you ever want to chat about this or have any concerns, please get in touch with the Designated Safeguarding Lead



ONLINE SAFETY

The NSPCC has recently reported that there has been a 36% increase in calls to ChildLine which are directly concerned with the sharing of images online, AI generated images and the related cyber bullying. Children and young people may consent to sending a nude image of themselves with other young people. They can also be forced, tricked or coerced into sharing images by other young people or adults online.

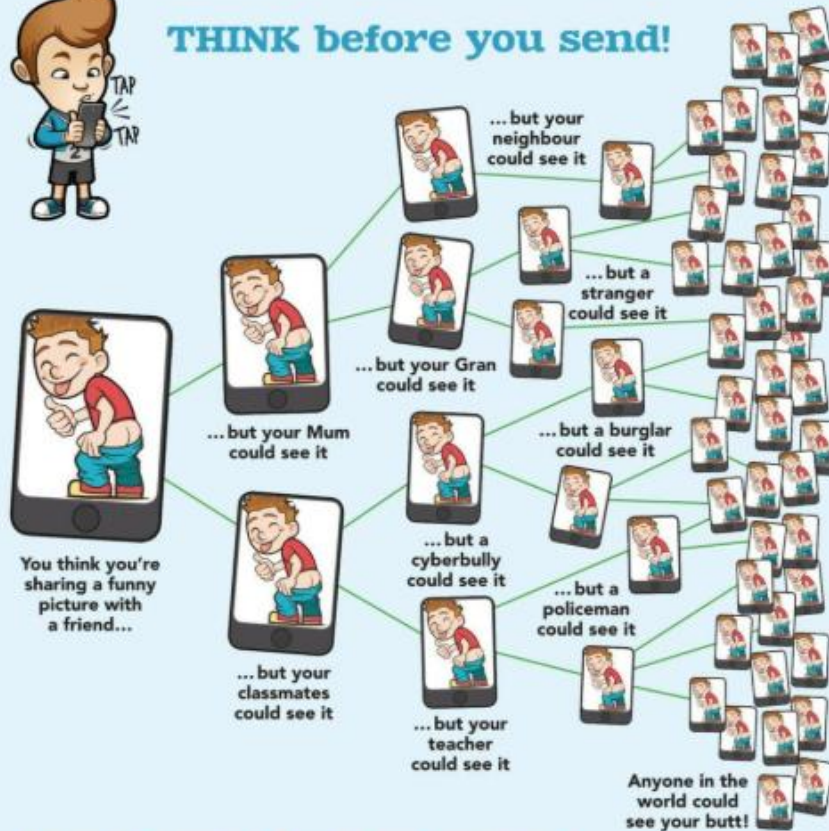
Whether a child or young person shares an image consensually or not, they have no control over and often no knowledge of how other people might use or share it.
